## NASA SELECTS YULISTA HOLDING, LLC SUBSIDIARY FOR AIRCRAFT OPERATIONS SUPPORT

Yulista Holding, LLC (YHL) subsidiary Yulista Tactical Services, LLC (YTS) has been awarded the Aircraft Maintenance, Logistics, Integration, Configuration Management and Engineering (ALICE) contract. The contract was awarded to YTS on December 18th with a maximum contract value of \$264 Million. YTS is honored to be chosen to support NASA Johnson Space Center (JSC) and their mission.

## TRIBES TAKE OVER CHILD WELFARE SERVICES

During the annual Alaska Federation of Natives (AFN) Convention, the State of Alaska reached a historic agreement with Tribes. State officials signed the Alaska Tribal Child Welfare Compact, a first-of-its-kind agreement allowing tribes and tribal organizations to address child welfare services in their communities in addition to the rights Tribes have under the Indian Child Welfare Act. This understanding is a step toward recognizing the importance of preserving Alaska Native culture through tribal involvement.

Under the agreement, the state Office of Children's Services will negotiate on an organization-by-organization basis certain responsibilities that will be handled by Tribes. This could include the placement of children, licensing foster homes and investigating child welfare cases.

**JON SIMEON, ALASKA STATE TROOPER AND SHAREHOLDER AWARDS WINNER**

As an Alaska State Trooper, Jon Simeon deals with a lot of tough issues on the job. From car accidents to investigating crimes, his job is difficult. But Jon is committed to making a difference on and off the job. He's dedicated to the prevention of suicide and domestic violence, and his passion for protecting people began long before his career in law enforcement.

Raised in Aniak, Jon saw firsthand the struggles people face with suicide, domestic violence, and drugs and alcohol in Western Alaska. At age 19, his best friend committed suicide. "That stuck with me forever. I've lost a dozen or so close friends and family to the act of suicide and that has stuck with me through my life and career," said Jon.

After attending college at the University of Alaska Fairbanks, Jon joined the U.S. Army. He spent just under eight years in the military before he returned to Alaska and was hired by the Alaska State Troopers. He's been stationed in Glennallen for the past 16 years.

Jon's passion for law enforcement started at an early age. He remembers a trooper visiting his elementary school in uniform with a safety bear. "As a young kid that rarely left the village, seeing the man in the uniform, I thought, 'how cool, he must have a great job,'" said Jon.

After serving as a trooper for several years, Jon decided he wanted to do even more to help people. Nine years ago, Jon started Ride For Life, a campaign to bring hope to people in Western Alaska. Along with two other troopers and a member of the National Park Service, the group snow machined along the Yukon River, speaking to people along the way. "We wanted to show kids we were invested in them," said Jon. "We wouldn't just fly in with a plane, we were in the town camping, we were there for them."

## George Guy, Board Vice-Chair

The Calista Corporation ("Calista") Board of Directors is seeking the nomination of Shareholders to run for the four (4) Director seats up for election at the Calista Annual Meeting of Shareholders on July 6, 2018 in Bethel, Alaska.

The Director seats open for election are **Administrative Unit 1** (Hooper Bay, Paimiut, Chevak, Scammon Bay), **Administrative Unit 2** (Alakanuk, Sheldon Point (Nunam Iqua), Bill Moore's Slough, Hamilton, Emmonak), **Administrative Unit 3** (Kotlik, Chuloonawick, Mountain Village, Pitkas Point, Saint Mary's) and **At-Large** (any Shareholder). Nominees must hold a voting Calista share associated with a village listed in the unit, be at least 18 years of age, promise to fully comply with the Calista Code of Business Ethics and Conduct for Directors upon election, and meet the other eligibility requirements in the Nominee Packet. Each Director will hold office for a term of three (3) years.

Nominees' completed Nominee Disclosure Questionnaire and Nominee Agreement must arrive at Calista's Anchorage office before 5 p.m. on Monday, April 9, 2018 by mail, fax, electronic transmission, or hand delivery.

### Calista Shareholder Resolution Solicitation

Shareholders who are individual or joint record owners of at least .25% of the outstanding shares of Calista may submit a Resolution for adoption or other Shareholder action at the Annual Meeting of Shareholders on July 6, 2018. Each Shareholder Resolution must include the name, address, number of shares, signature, and

date of signature of each Shareholder submitting the Resolution. Shareholder Resolutions must also include the name and contact information for at least one Proponent and a supporting statement of 500 words or less. The Proponent shall be a Shareholder. The Proponent shall be responsible for ensuring that the Resolution complies with the Calista Election Policies and Procedures and all other applicable laws. The proposed Resolution and other required information must **arrive** at Calista's Anchorage office by mail, fax, electronic transmission, or hand delivery before 5 p.m. on Thursday, March 29, 2018.

Ride For Life was meant to show students in villages it's possible to grow up in a village and have a successful career. And while proud of the work he's done, Jon says there's a lot more work to be done to help Youth, especially with new drugs coming into villages. "It's like a forest fire in the summer in Alaska, it's running everything over," Jon said.

Last year, Jon was recognized for his career and community outreach by being awarded the Axel C. Johnson Distinguished Shareholder award at Calista's Annual Meeting of Shareholders. "In my career as a trooper and in the military, we do our job, we are asked to do a hard job, at any time of the day, with little or no thank you when you are done. When I got the phone call saying I received this award, I was taken aback. I was really proud to receive something like this from my own people," Jon said.

# SUBSIDIARY WINS EXCELLENCE IN CONSTRUCTION AWARD



Calista Corporation subsidiary STG Inc. was recently recognized with an Excellence in Construction Award for its work in rural Alaska. The Associated General Contractors (AGC) of Alaska, the state's largest construction trade association, honored individuals, contractors, projects and safety programs in Alaska. The awards were handed out in November.

STG's Excellence in Construction Award for a Specialty Contractor in Transportation, Marine, Heavy and Earthmoving was for GCI's Terrestrial for Every Rural Region in Alaska (TERRA) project. The TERRA project brings a next-generation

communications network to more than 45,000 rural Alaskans. Starting in 2010, STG began building 3,300 miles of fiber-optic network in 84 villages. These villages now have high-speed terrestrial broadband service through one of the world's largest fiber-microwave networks in the country.

Calista's goal is to provide economic prosperity to its Shareholders. The Calista Region is one of the most remote parts of the country, with few roads and limited access, technology is vital to the Region's economy. Advances in technology are providing increased opportunities for education for our students and business opportunities. Through our subsidiaries, we will continue to bring benefits to our Shareholders.

Last spring, another Calista subsidiary, Tunista Construction, earned a Safety Excellence award from AGC of Washington.

# ENROLLMENT UPDATE

Calista Corporation began the Descendant and missed enrollee enrollment process in 2015, after several votes by the Board and Shareholders, and opened enrollment officially in January 2017. In addition to traveling throughout the Region, broadcasting on VHF, posting fliers, doing village walk-throughs and doing school presentations, enrollment staff phone-banked potential enrollees, sent mail and emails, delivered messages on social media, maintained a website, participated in KYUK call-ins and PSAs, staged open houses in Anchorage and Bethel, wrote content for "Yaaruin" and "The Delta Discovery," visited community hubs and gatherings, and attended the Shareholder Annual Meeting in Sleetmute.

Did you see us at the ASAA March Madness or Cama-i? We were there. How about NYO, AVTEC, Job Corps, WEIO, AFN, UAF Rural Students Center, UAA Native Student Services, TCC, or the BIA Tribal Providers Conference? We were there, too!


